





GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Adult and Junior Exhibitors at the North Haven Fair Note: All entries must be received by 31 August 2022

- 1. All articles exhibited must be the property of the exhibitor.
- 2. Please clearly label your item with the Department, Class number, and Exhibitor's name and address in a place where label may not be seen while item is on display.
- 3. Size of exhibits is at the discretion of the Superintendent.
- 4. Please complete an official entry form (at the back of this guide, or available to print or submit online; copies accepted) with a list of the items you intend to exhibit.
- 5. **Save a stamp!** Fill out your entry form online at: <u>www.NorthHaven-Fair.com/Exhibitors</u>or email entry form to <u>Jeanne.northhavenfair@gmail.com</u>
- 6. You may enter as many classes as you like; one item per class unless otherwise specified.
- 7. Exhibits must be left on display until the close of the Fair at 7:00 pm on Sunday, September 11, 2022, or they will be disqualified.
- 8. Exhibits **MUST** be picked up no later than 8:00pm on Sunday, September 11, 2022, or they will be disposed of at the convenience of the North Haven Fair.
- 9. The Fair Committee will use all diligence to ensure the safety of exhibits after arrival on the grounds but in no case shall the North Haven Fair Association, Inc., or any of its Officers, Superintendents, or Directors be held responsible for any loss, damage, injury, or death by disease, theft, or from any other cause whatsoever to any property while same is on the Fairgrounds or at any other time or place. The Management hereby assumes no responsibility for any property being brought and kept on the fairgrounds. If the property owners or others interested in the property, desire protection against loss, or injury from fire or any other cause, they must make their own arrangements and pay for such insurance.
- 10. No person except the Exhibitor, Judge, Superintendent, or regular attendants shall handle or interfere in any way with any item on exhibit without express permission of the exhibitor.
- 11. Decision of Judges is final.
- 12. The North Haven Fair Association will not be responsible for any errors in printing.

Schedule of Exhibits

- 1. All entry forms must be submitted and received by **August 31, 2022**.
- All Photography exhibits (Departments O and Y), Home Arts exhibits (Departments. I, J, K, L, M, N, V, W, and X) and Group Exhibits (Department Z) must be brought to the Fairgrounds on **Tuesday** September 6th between 7:00pm and 9:00pm.
- All Agricultural Exhibits (Junior and Adult) including Vegetables (Depts. B and P), Flowers, Baking, and Canning (Depts. A, C, D, E, F, G, H, Q, R, S, T, and U) must be brought to the Fairgrounds on Wednesday September 7, 2022, between 7:00pm and 9:00pm or Thursday September 8, 2022, between 7:00am and 8:30am. No exhibits will be accepted after this time.
- 4. Exhibits must remain in place until 7:00pm on Sunday, September 11, 2022, or they will be disqualified.
- 5. Exhibits **MUST** be picked up by **8:00pm on September 11, 2022 or** will be disposed of at the convenience of the North Haven Fair Association.
- Premiums (prize money) will be paid as noted. Premiums will be available at the Fair Main Office on Sunday September 11th between 3:00pm and 8:00pm. Premiums will not be mailed, and if unclaimed will be forfeited.

Department A – Flowers

Rosette Ribbons will be awarded for "Best in Horticulture," "Best Floral Arrangement," and

"Best House Plant."

- Only one exhibit per person in each class.
- Open to all amateur flower growers
- Exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor.
- All containers must be furnished by the exhibitor and MUST be in CLEAR, COLORLESS, GLASS containers free from printed matter to be accepted.
- All House Plants must not be larger than 12" diameter pot and not to exceed 20 lbs. in weight.
- No artificial flowers or foliage permitted in arrangements.
- No plant material on the State Conservation List may be used.
- Collect materials in the evening or early morning. Place for a few hours in deep water in a cool place out of a draft. Be sure that plant leaves are clean and free from dirt spots. Avoid disease, insect, or spray injured plant material. These will be sprayed or removed at the discretion of the superintendent.

Wednesday, September 7, 2022, between 7:00pm and 9:00 pm, or Thursday, September 8, 2022, between 7:00 am and 8:30 am.



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2022 State Baking Contests Rules

Each year The Association of Connecticut Fairs sponsors baking contests open to the public at participating member fairs. There are separate contests for Junior and Adult divisions, each with a specific recipe and a Two-Crusted Apple Pie Baking contest.

WHO MAY ENTER: The contest at each participating member fair is open to all men, women and juniors. Commercial, industrial or professional bakers are not eligible. Divisions: Juniors (ages 7 to 15 as of July 1st) and Adult.



HOW TO ENTER: Any baker entering a contest at any participating member fair is automatically entered and competing in the local contest. Contestants may enter the contest at as many fairs as they wish until they win first prize. They will then represent that fair at the state baking contest. Please submit entries to both the local and state contest on disposable plates. The Association of Connecticut Fairs and the member fairs are not responsible for the return of plates, trays or containers.

JUDGING: Judging will be based on appearance, flavor, and texture. The Association of Connecticut Fairs will furnish judges' score sheets to each fair and the contestant will receive these sheets at the end of the contest. Additions, deletions, or substitutions in the recipe are not permitted and will result in disqualification. All decisions of the judges are final.

LOCAL CONTEST: The winner of the local contest will receive a blue ribbon from the Association of Connecticut Fairs and will then become eligible to submit their entry at the state contest. In the event that only one entry is received at the local contest and that entry is worthy of first prize, that entry must be awarded the first-place ribbon.

STATE CONTEST: The state contest is held as part of the Fall Meeting and Convention of the Association of Connecticut Fairs. Entries for the state contest are accepted from **8:00 am to 10:00 a.m.** on the day of the judging (contact your local fair or visit <u>www.ctagfairs.org</u> for the date and location). Contest winners are announced at the Fall Meeting. Each fair is responsible for contacting their contest winner and providing them with information. The Association of Connecticut Fairs does not contact individual fairs or contest winners in regard to contest and banquet reservations nor does the Association of Connecticut Fairs cover the costs of attending the awards banquet. **NO BANQUET RESERVATIONS FOR CONTEST WINNERS WILL BE ACCEPTED AT THE DOOR.**

Association of Connecticut Fairs Adult Baking Contest 2022 Abraham Lincoln Cake

Ingredients For the cake:

1. Abraham Lincoln Cake

- 6 large egg whites
- 2 cups sugar, divided
- 1 cup butter
- 3 cups King Arthur Baking Company All-Purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 ¹/₂ teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon almond extract
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 1 ¼ cups blanched almonds, toasted and finely chopped

For the boiled frosting:

1 ½ cups sugar 2/3 cup water 1/8 teaspoon Cream of Tartar 3 egg whites salt, to taste 1 teaspoon vanilla extract Sliced almonds, for garnish

Directions: For the cake:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.

Grease a 10-inch Bundt pan

Beat the egg whites until frothy.

Add 1 cup sugar gradually into the egg whites while beating them, until stiff peaks form. Set aside. Cream together the butter and the remaining 1 cup sugar until light and fluffy. Set aside.

In a separate bowl, sift together the flour, baking powder, and salt. Set aside.

Combine the vanilla and almond extracts with the buttermilk. Set aside.

Stir the blanched, toasted, chopped almonds into the flour mixture.

Then add both the butter/sugar mixture and the buttermilk mixture into the dry ingredients, doing so in thirds and mixing until just combined.

Gently fold the eqg white mixture into the batter, careful not to deflate it or overmix it.



Pour the batter into the prepared Bundt pan.

Bake until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 1 hour.

Remove the cake from the oven and allow it to cool completely before frosting.

For the boiled frosting:

In a heavy saucepan on the stovetop over medium heat, combine the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups sugar with the water and Cream of Tartar.

Bring the mixture to a boil, using a wetted brush to remove any sugar crystals.

Cover the mixture and let it boil until a candy thermometer reads 245 degrees F., for about 3 minutes. Beat the 3 egg whites with some salt, until glossy and peaked.

While you beat the egg whites, slowly and gradually pour the syrup mixture in. Continue beating until the mixture is cool and the frosting is firm and fluffy.

Fold in the vanilla extract.

Frost the cake. Be generous with the frosting (you will have extra).

Garnish the top with sliced almonds.

Submit the cake on a foil-wrapped round cardboard no wider than an inch from the cake.





- Exhibitors MUST have health charts and rabies vaccination certificates to show at Connecticut fairs per CT Dept. of Agriculture regulations and rules.
- All female animals 3 months of age or over MUST be vaccinated for Rabies.
- Certificate of rabies vaccination must be present.
- Registered stock only with certificates submitted to Superintendent, with exception of market beef.
- All breeds classified the same but shown separately. Premiums will be paid on the following breeds only: Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey, Milking Shorthorn, Angus, Hereford, Simmental, Chianina, and Cross-bred and all other beef breeds.
- All exhibitors shall furnish their own hay and grain.
- Cattle must arrive on Thursday, September 8, 2022, after 12 noon and before 9:00pm and stay in place until Sunday, September 11, 2022, at 7:00pm.
- Judging of Dairy Cattle will be on **Saturday, September 10, 2022**, at 10:00am. Beef Cattle will follow Dairy at about 1:00pm.
- Exhibitors will be assigned specified areas in the barn, no exceptions. All animals must be double tied.
- Entry fee MUST accompany entry blank with a check made out to the North Haven Fair. Entry fee is \$2.00 per animal and must be sent with entry form. Entry blanks MUST be mailed only, and no entry will be accepted *before* the August 15 postmark. Entries will be accepted by the Superintendent ONLY. Notification of cancellation must be given to Superintendent ASAP or deposit will be forfeited. Postmarked mail only. Include a copy of health papers and **highlight entered animals**.
- Each exhibitor will receive one wristband to enter the livestock gate (Orange Gate 1) at any time during the fair. Up to 2 additional wristbands per exhibitor will be available for purchase for \$20 each and must be used by those involved with the care of the cattle. The wristbands are for use all 4 days that the Fair is open. The wristbands may be ordered ahead of time on the entry form and the fees sent in with the entry form. Make checks out to North Haven Fair. Wristbands must be worn for entry. The North Haven Fair is not responsible for lost wristbands.
- Junior show is open to anyone 19 years or younger as of the last day of the Fair. Juniors must show in showmanship to receive junior money. Junior premiums are 25% of open show. All animals bought or leased by juniors must be in Junior's name by May 1. Any lease agreement must be available, signed also by May 1, also must be typewritten. Showmanship animals must be owned or leased in the junior's name. All other junior animals must be registered in the junior's name to qualify for junior premiums.
- Exhibitor is the farm title or person's name that appears as owner of the animal on registration. The name of the breeder must be the same as the owner to be exhibited in "Best Three Females."
- There will only be allowed 3 entries per class and only 2 entries per group classes, per exhibitor.
- Market Beef is open to steers that will not be shown in breed classes, and no steers in group classes.
- All animals and exhibitors not complying with these regulations will be removed from the Fairgrounds, and any animals whose health or physical condition is in question is subject to an exam by a veterinarian at the owner's expense.
- No animals or entries will be accepted once the barns are full.
- No bulls will be allowed in Beef Show or Dairy.
- Exhibitors will be limited to 8 animals per exhibitor, farm, club, or family. If extra space is available, it will be divided up. You will be notified only if you can bring extra. Please specify "extra" on the bottom of entry form.
- Out-of-state exhibitors are limited to 5 animals per family, club, farm, etc. with the above rules.
- To balance out the showmanship classes, it may be necessary to combine or alter those classes.
- When there is no competition in a class, each animal will be judged and placed according to its own merit. Premiums paid in accordance with placing, the Judge's decision is final.
- Only 3 leased animals are allowed per exhibitor.
- All exhibitors must provide a barrier between general public and livestock.
- No structural changes to barns, including auto water drinkers, without prior approval from the Superintendent.



All sheep are to be in show condition and properly trimmed, or smoothly shorn.
- Exhibitors must furnish their own feed and feed hay. Exhibitors must provide adequate food for the duration of the Fair. Water pails must be provided by the exhibitor for their sheep on exhibition. - Sheep judging will commence on Saturday, September 11, 2021, at 10:00am. All decisions of the judge will be final.

- Animals will be accepted Wednesday, September 7, 2022, between 1:00pm and 6:00pm. All exhibits must be in place by 6:00pm. Judging will begin at 6:30 pm.
- No advertising will be permitted on coops until after judging is completed.
- Minimum entry fee will be \$6.00 for juniors and \$10.00 for adults. There is a charge of 50 cents per bird or rabbit entry. If only one animal is shown, the fee is \$6.00 for juniors and \$10.00 for adults. Entry fees must be paid and sent along with entry forms. First 6 entries free with Pass.
- No refunds given on scratched entries.
- All exhibits must remain in their cages until coop out time, last day of the fair. Exhibits removed before coop out time shall forfeit their prizes and winnings without exception.

- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 large egg, at room temperature
- 1/2 cup buttermilk, at room temperature
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cup King Arthur Baking Company All-Purpose Flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ¹/₂ teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 ¹/₂ cups carrots, grated
- ¹/₂ cup coconut, shredded
- ¹/₄ cup golden raisins
- ¹/₂ cup pecans, chopped

Directions:

- Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.
